HOMELESSNESS CAN STRIKE ANYONE.



In early 2009, in the midst of a depressed economy and bone chilling temperatures, many of Danville's citizens found themselves without a roof over their heads. Danville's only homeless shelter had closed, and without food or heat, it seemed like there was little hope for the men, women and children who were without a place to call "home."

Concerned with this situation, a group of business leaders and local ministers gathered together to see what could be done. With the help of anonymous donors, the shelter was temporarily re-opened and a board was soon formed to seek a long-term plan to care for area citizens who found themselves homeless.

Within a few months, a more sustainable location was found on South Ridge Street and plans were made for the necessary renovations and financing. With the generosity of area citizens a down-payment was made and the first phase of renovations was completed to get the building up to code.

After moving to a new location on Ridge Street, the House of Hope has come to represent a new chapter of hope in the lives of many. Today, the House of Hope serves men, women and children in need with a safe overnight stay, hot meals, and a variety of support services.

APPRENTICESHIP

House of Hope offers ways to get specialized training with adaptive skills for better achievement. Some of our homeless citizens have exceptional barriers. Our goal is to help each participant by bringing together business leaders and our homeless guests through this apprenticeship arrangement to reach success for employment. Our men and women will be equipped with the knowledge and confidence they need to pursue life-long career goals and learn how to support themselves.
